The South Carolina Department of Public Safety's Office of Highway Safety and Justice Programs (OHSJP) is pleased to announce a combined solicitation for FFY 2019 criminal and juvenile justice grant programs. The Office of Highway Safety and Justice Programs will host a Grant Solicitation Workshop on **Wednesday, January 16, 2019** at the Bill Rogers Community Connections Center at the S.C. Department of Juvenile Justice, located at 4900 Broad River Road in Columbia. A map is enclosed. The workshop will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., with registration beginning at 8:30 a.m. For those participants interested in receiving additional help with a grant project your agency is considering, or if you have specific questions regarding an application, OHSJP staff will be available after the workshop to provide any assistance needed to help you with your grant application.

In an effort to become more environmentally conscious, workshop materials will only be available on our website (www.scdps.sc.gov/ohsjp) for download prior to January 16. Only the PowerPoint slides will be distributed at the workshop.

The workshop will provide state and local units of government, as well as nonprofit organizations, with information regarding the application process, due dates (where known), funding priorities, and tips for successful grant writing. The federal grant programs discussed in the workshop will include: Justice Assistance Grants; the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants; the Juvenile Justice Formula Grants; and the Project Safe Neighborhoods Grants. All applications will be submitted via the brand new "SCDPS Grants" system at www.scdpsgrants.com.

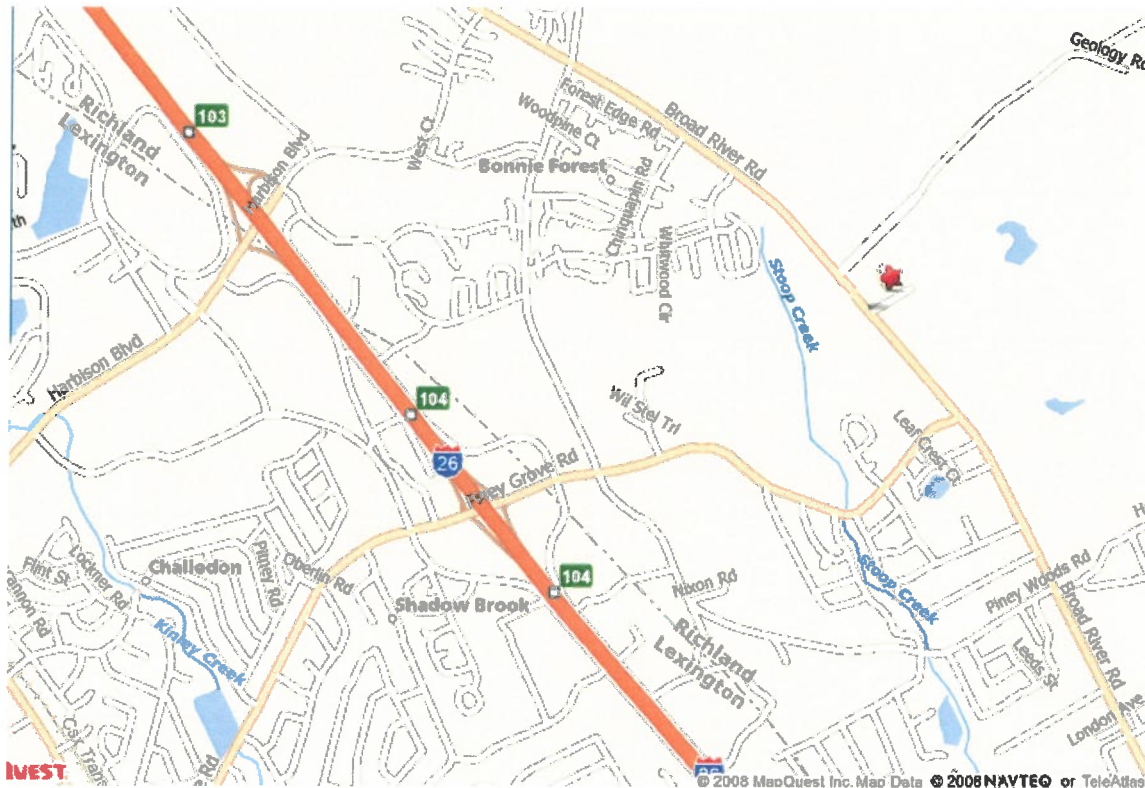
