

SUBJECT: Provisos 117.21 and 118.19(D) Requirements

Please note Proviso 118.19(D) requires “*for purposes of item (B)(78) and all items thereafter*” that “*funds **shall not be disbursed** until verification that receiver’s organization is registered as a business, nonprofit, or charitable organization with the South Carolina Secretary of State’s office.*”

Proviso 117.21 directs “*each state agency receiving funds that are a direct appropriation to a non-profit organization, prior to disbursing the funds, shall require from each recipient organization a plan of how the state funds will be spent and how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. The Executive Budget Office, Department of Administration shall provide each state agency with a standard form for collecting the information required...*”

Therefore, when submitting *applicable* documents to our office for processing, please include the following as attachments to each document and this information must be the **first** pages of the attachment before any other documentation is provided:

- 1) A *photocopy* of the specific numeric section in paragraph (B) of Proviso 118.19 that lists the contribution – *with the recipient organization and the contribution amount highlighted (highlighting is essential)*.
- 2) A copy of the completed Form as required by Proviso 117.21 and,
- 3) A copy of the receiver organization’s registration as obtained from the SC Secretary of State’s office as required by Proviso 118.19 (D).

In addition to the above request, please note that these expenditures must be coded to General Ledger Account # 5180750000-AID ENTITIES.

118.19. (SR: Nonrecurring Revenue) (A) The source of revenue appropriated in subsection (B) is nonrecurring revenue generated from the following sources:

- (1) \$1,023,777,259 from Fiscal Year 2020-21 Contingency Reserve Fund;
- (2) \$2,853,646,014 from Fiscal Year 2021-22 Projected Surplus;
- (3) \$16,832,497 from Fiscal Year 2021-22 Debt Service in Excess Obligation;
- (4) \$53,898,508 from Litigation Recovery Account;
- (5) \$525,000,000 from Savannah River Site Litigation; and

This revenue is deemed to have occurred and is available for use in Fiscal Year 2022-23 after September 1, 2022, following the Comptroller General's close of the state's books on Fiscal Year 2021-22.


Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

Wild hogs (often referred to as wild pigs, wild boar, and feral swine), which are not native to the ecosystem of the Southeastern United States, cause extensive damage to agriculture and thus represent a primary species of concern to agricultural producers across much of the U.S. There are approximately 138,000 wild pigs in South Carolina that cause millions in damages to agriculture, native habitats, and property annually. Additionally, wild pigs are known for carrying a number of diseases. This includes 34 pathogens identified by the World Organization for Animal Health as important causes of disease in livestock, wildlife, and humans. To expand the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Wildlife Services' wild hog management services due to the increasing requests from the agricultural community, additional resources are needed which includes personnel, equipment, and supplies. Funding will cover salary and benefits travel, equipment, supplies, and other costs directly related to activities performed by Wildlife Services personnel in conducting wildlife damage management services. Goals of this program include: (1) inform the public of the problem's feral swine cause and the need to eliminate them; (2) prevent establishment of new populations, control the sources of feral swine, and remove incentives for releasing hogs; and (3) develop and implement a strategy to reduce feral swine damage to agriculture in South Carolina.

Note: The distribution of the budget from this financial plan may vary as necessary to accomplish the purpose of this agreement, but may not exceed \$750,000.00.

COOPERATIVE SERVICE AGREEMENT
between
SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY (SCDPS)
and
UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE (APHIS)
WILDLIFE SERVICES (WS)

ARTICLE 1 – PURPOSE

The purpose of this Cooperative Service Agreement is to facilitate WS providing wildlife damage management services for feral swine causing damage to landowners in the State of South Carolina.

ARTICLE 2 – AUTHORITY

APHIS-WS has statutory authority under the Acts of March 2, 1931, 46 Stat. 1468-69, 7 U.S.C. §§ 8351-8352, as amended, and December 22, 1987, Public Law No. 100-202, § 101(k), 101 Stat. 1329-331, 7 U.S.C. § 8353, to cooperate with States, local jurisdictions, individuals, public and private agencies, organizations, and institutions while conducting a program of wildlife services involving mammal and bird species that are reservoirs for zoonotic diseases, or animal species that are injurious and/or a nuisance to, among other things, agriculture, horticulture, forestry, animal husbandry, wildlife, and human health and safety.

ARTICLE 3 - MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The cooperating parties mutually understand and agree to/that:

1. APHIS-WS shall perform services set forth in the Work Plan, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The parties may mutually agree in writing, at any time during the term of this agreement, to amend, modify, add or delete services from the Work Plan.
2. The Cooperator (SCDPS) certifies that APHIS-WS has advised the SCDPS there may be private sector service providers available to provide wildlife damage management (WDM) services that the Cooperator is seeking from APHIS-WS.
3. There will be no equipment with a procurement price of \$5,000 or more per unit purchased directly with funds from the cooperator for use on this project. All other equipment purchased for the program is and will remain the property of APHIS-WS.
4. The cooperating parties agree to coordinate with each other before responding to media requests on work associated with this project.

ARTICLE 4 - COOPERATOR RESPONSIBILITIES

SCDPS agrees:

1. To designate the following as the SCDPS authorized representative who shall be responsible for collaboratively administering the activities conducted in this agreement:

2. To authorize APHIS-WS to conduct direct control activities as defined in the Work Plan.
3. To disperse \$750,000.00 to APHIS-WS pursuant to South Carolina General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2022-2023 and subject to any all limitations and requirements outlined in S.C. Code Ann. § 11-9-10, Proviso 117.21, and Executive Order 2022-19.
4. To provide a Tax Identification Number in compliance with the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996.
5. As a condition of this agreement, SCDPS ensures and certifies that it is not currently debarred or suspended and is free of delinquent Federal debt.
6. To notify APHIS-WS verbally or in writing as far in advance as practical of the date and time of any proposed meeting related to the program.
7. SCDPS acknowledges that APHIS-WS shall be responsible for administration of APHIS-WS activities and supervision of APHIS-WS personnel.

ARTICLE 5 – APHIS-WS RESPONSIBILITIES

APHIS-WS Agrees:

- 1) To designate the following as the APHIS-WS authorized representative who shall be responsible for collaboratively administering the activities conducted in this agreement.

- 2) To conduct activities at sites designated by SCDPS as described in the Work and Financial Plans. APHIS-WS will provide qualified personnel and other resources necessary to implement the approved WDM activities delineated in the Work Plan and Financial Plan of this agreement.
- 3) That the performance of wildlife damage management actions by APHIS-WS under this agreement is contingent upon a determination by APHIS-WS that such actions are in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act, Endangered Species Act, and any other applicable federal statutes. APHIS-WS will not make a final decision to conduct requested wildlife damage management actions until it has made the determination of such compliance.
- 4) To deposit \$750,000.00 as specified in the Financial Plan upon execution of this Cooperative Service Agreement for services agreed upon and specified in the Work Plan. Authorized auditing representatives of the Cooperator shall be accorded reasonable opportunity to inspect the accounts and records of APHIS-WS pertaining to such claims for reimbursement to the extent permitted by Federal law and regulations.

ARTICLE 6 – CONTINGENCY STATEMENT

This agreement is contingent upon the passage by Congress of an appropriation from which expenditures may be legally met and shall not obligate APHIS-WS upon failure of Congress to so appropriate. This agreement may also be reduced or terminated if Congress only provides APHIS-WS funds for a finite period under a Continuing Resolution.

ARTICLE 7 – NON-EXCLUSIVE SERVICE CLAUSE

Nothing in this agreement shall prevent APHIS-WS from entering into separate agreements with any other organization or individual for the purpose of providing wildlife damage management services exclusive of those provided for under this agreement.

ARTICLE 8 – CONGRESSIONAL RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to Section 22, Title 41, United States Code, no member of or delegate to Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement or to any benefit to arise therefrom.

ARTICLE 9 – LAWS AND REGULATIONS

This agreement is not a procurement contract (31 U.S.C. 6303), nor is it considered a grant (31 U.S.C. 6304). In this agreement, APHIS-WS provides goods or services on a cost recovery basis to nonfederal recipients, in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations and policies.

ARTICLE 10 – LIABILITY

APHIS-WS assumes no liability for any actions or activities conducted under this agreement except to the extent that recourse or remedies are provided by Congress under the Federal Tort Claims Act (28 U.S.C. 1346(b), 2401(b), and 2671-2680).

ARTICLE 11 – NON-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

The United States Department of Agriculture prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, and where applicable, sex, marital status, familial status, parental status, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, political beliefs, reprisal, or because all or part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program. Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.


ARTICLE 12 - DURATION, REVISIONS, EXTENSIONS, AND TERMINATIONS

This agreement shall become effective on October 1, 2022 and shall continue through September 30, 2023. This Cooperative Service Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties in writing. SCDPS must submit a written request to extend the end date at least 10 days prior to expiration of the agreement. Also, this agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual agreement of the parties in writing, or by one party provided that party notifies the other in writing at least 60 days prior to effecting such action. Further, in the event SCDPS does not provide the appropriated State funds, APHIS-WS is relieved of the obligation to provide services under this agreement.

In accordance with the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, the Department of Treasury requires a Taxpayer Identification Number for individuals or businesses conducting business with the agency.

RE: One-Time Appropriations, FY 22-23 Reporting Requirements

Dear Mr. Myers:

On July 1, 2022, the General Appropriations Act became effective, providing the revenue for State government to meet its budgetary expenses for fiscal year 2022-2023. This year's budget included allocations to the South Carolina Department of Public Safety ("SCDPS") reserved as one-time appropriations to outside organizations. The table below indicates the funds which have been allotted in our agency's budget for your organization.



The Act also includes Proviso 117.21 which outlines reporting requirements for organizations receiving state appropriations. These requirements mandate that, prior to the release of funds, a recipient organization must (1) provide a plan of how the state funds will be spent and (2) describe how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. After receiving the funds, the organization shall provide quarterly spending updates to the respective state agency. After all state funds have been expended, the organization shall further provide an accounting of how the funds were spent. Additionally, the proviso forbids the disbursement of funds to organizations or purposes which practice discrimination against persons by virtue of race, creed, color or national origin.

Furthermore, Executive Order 2022-19 requires all information submitted by your organization be published on the SCDPS website. This information will also be shared with the Executive Budget Office ("EBO"), the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee. Please utilize the attached EBO forms to compile the information your organization submits.

After receiving the funds, non-profit organizations shall provide quarterly spending updates to the respective state agency. After all state funds have been expended, each organization shall provide an accounting of how the funds were spent. State agencies receiving funds pursuant to this provision shall report the information collected to the Executive Budget Office, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee by June 30th. No funds in this act shall be disbursed to organizations or purposes which practice discrimination against persons by virtue of race, creed, color or national origin.

In accordance with the Cooperative Service Agreement between South Carolina Department of Public Safety (SCDPS) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA); Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), Wildlife Services (WS), this Work Plan sets forth the objectives, activities, and budget of this project during the period of this agreement.

Program Objective

To facilitate WS providing wildlife damage management services to reduce damage to agriculture, timber, wildlife-habitat, natural areas, and endangered or threatened species or their habitats in the state. The proposed wildlife damage management program will be comprised of direct and technical assistance aimed at resolving wildlife damage caused by feral swine in the State of South Carolina.

Plan of Action

WS activities under this cooperative effort will be limited to the State of South Carolina. Techniques will be environmentally sound, safe, and selective. Both Federal and State permits will be secured by WS, if necessary, to perform wildlife damage management activities and these activities will be in accordance with WS' policy guidelines. All program activities will be conducted within compliance of State and Federal regulations.

Costs for execution of this agreement will be \$750,000.00 to cover salary and benefits, travel, equipment, supplies, and other costs directly related to activities performed by WS personnel in conducting wildlife damage management services.

WS will be responsible in providing SCDPS reports in accordance to Proviso 117.21 which outlines the reporting requirements for organizations receiving state appropriations. This includes (1) provide a plan of how the state funds will be spent and (2) describe how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. Quarterly expenditure reports as outlined in S.C. Code Ann. § 11-9-10, Proviso 117.21, and Executive Order 2022-19 and an annual accounting report to SCDPS on WS activities conducted under this Cooperative Service Agreement.
