SUBJECT: Provisos 117.21 and 118.19(D) Requirements

Please note Proviso 118.19(D) requires “*for purposes of item (B)(78) and all items thereafter*” that “*funds **shall not be disbursed** until verification that receiver’s organization is registered as a business, nonprofit, or charitable organization with the South Carolina Secretary of State’s office.*”

Proviso 117.21 directs “*each state agency receiving funds that are a direct appropriation to a non-profit organization, prior to disbursing the funds, shall require from each recipient organization a plan of how the state funds will be spent and how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. The Executive Budget Office, Department of Administration shall provide each state agency with a standard form for collecting the information required...*”

Therefore, when submitting *applicable* documents to our office for processing, please include the following as attachments to each document and this information must be the **first** pages of the attachment before any other documentation is provided:

- 1) A *photocopy* of the specific numeric section in paragraph (B) of Proviso 118.19 that lists the contribution – *with the recipient organization and the contribution amount highlighted (highlighting is essential).*
- 2) A copy of the completed Form as required by Proviso 117.21 and,
- 3) A copy of the receiver organization’s registration as obtained from the SC Secretary of State’s office as required by Proviso 118.19 (D).

**118.19.** (SR: Nonrecurring Revenue) (A) The source of revenue appropriated in subsection (B) is nonrecurring revenue generated from the following sources:

- (1) \$1,023,777,259 from Fiscal Year 2020-21 Contingency Reserve Fund;
- (2) \$2,853,646,014 from Fiscal Year 2021-22 Projected Surplus;
- (3) \$16,832,497 from Fiscal Year 2021-22 Debt Service in Excess Obligation;
- (4) \$53,898,508 from Litigation Recovery Account;
- (5) \$525,000,000 from Savannah River Site Litigation; and
- (6) \$100,000,000 from Estimated Excess Debt Service above Projected Expenditures.

Any restrictions concerning specific utilization of these funds are lifted for the specified fiscal year. The above agency transfers shall occur no later than thirty days after the close of the books on Fiscal Year 2021-22 and shall be available for use in Fiscal Year 2022-23.

This revenue is deemed to have occurred and is available for use in Fiscal Year 2022-23 after September 1, 2022, following the Comptroller General's close of the state's books on Fiscal Year 2021-22.

(B) The appropriations in this provision are listed in priority order. Item (1) must be funded first and each remaining item must be fully funded before any funds are allocated to the next item. Provided, however, that any individual item may be partially funded in the order in which it appears to the extent that revenues are available.

Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

The Spartanburg Police department desires to start up a Real Time Crime Center similar to what has been done in other cities around the United States. Notably in proximity of us: Charlotte, NC, Winston Salem, NC, Buncombe, NC, Fayetteville, NC, and N. Charleston, SC. We have been exploring this possibility for over a year and have found that there must be a video collections system (FUSUS) which can translate the video formatting and have secured video storage. This platform also allows the seamless integration of other systems such as the Flock gunshot detection system and the Flock license plate recognition system. This system is being used currently in Anderson and Greenville, SC. It will allow us to share information on criminal intelligence between agencies. Briefcam Investigator is an artificial intelligence system which can be used to search videos for specific people/items/vehicles at specific dates/times. The aerial surveillance drone will allow us to capture a different perspective of video we are currently not capable of getting and help with the search for missing/wanted persons who have fled arrest. We will be constantly building on this system to include city owned/operated cameras. These funds will allow us to contract/purchase the above items and begin our version of a Real Time Crime Center. It will be a force multiplier! Just the LPR system alone has the potential of locating stolen vehicles, missing persons, wanted persons and person's of interest vehicles. incorporating this with the gunshot detection system which will be placed in an area of our city where we have found little to no cooperation at times from the citizens when we have a shooting incident along with the LPR system could possible give us leads to investigate where we have none before. Our intent is to grow the RTCC by adding more software/systems in the future to aid in the detection, apprehension and conviction of those who choose to commit a crime in our city. With these systems, it will absolutely make our city a safer place.

Dear Chief Thompson:

On July 1, 2022, the General Appropriations Act became effective, providing the revenue for State government to meet its budgetary expenses for fiscal year 2022-2023. This year's budget included allocations to the South Carolina Department of Public Safety ("SCDPS") reserved as one-time appropriations to outside organizations. The table below indicates the funds which have been allotted in our agency's budget for your organization.

Agency Receiving Contribution/ Project	Amount
Spartanburg Police Department	\$ 490,000.00

The Act also includes Proviso 117.21 which outlines reporting requirements for organizations receiving state appropriations. These requirements mandate that, prior to the release of funds, a recipient organization must (1) provide a plan of how the state funds will be spent and (2) describe how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. After receiving the funds, the organization shall provide quarterly spending updates to the respective state agency. After all state funds have been expended, the organization shall further provide an accounting of how the funds were spent. Additionally, the proviso forbids the disbursement of funds to organizations or purposes which practice discrimination against persons by virtue of race, creed, color or national origin.

Furthermore, Executive Order 2022-19 requires all information submitted by your organization be published on the SCDPS website. This information will also be shared with the Executive Budget Office ("EBO"), the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee. Please utilize the attached EBO forms to compile the information your organization submits.

**OPERATION OF STATE GOVERNMENT**

**117.21.** (GP: Organizations Receiving State Appropriations Report). Each state agency receiving funds that are a direct appropriation to a non-profit organization, prior to disbursing the funds, shall require from each recipient organization a plan of how the state funds will be spent and how the expenditures will provide a public benefit. The Executive Budget Office, Department of Administration shall provide each state agency with a standard form for collecting the information required. After receiving the funds, non-profit organizations shall provide quarterly spending updates to the respective state agency. After all state funds have been expended, each organization shall provide an accounting of how the funds were spent. State agencies receiving funds pursuant to this provision shall report the information collected to the Executive Budget Office, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee by June 30th.
